Fast-forward two and half years to this past February and the payment for the new property was owed. We now have students, staff, and the accreditation in process. One out of the 3 properties has sold in St. Vincent and the other 2 are in contract. There is still a heavy penalty owed to the Baptists each month along with rent. We would appreciate your prayers for the sale to be completed quickly. Then, we should only be about \$150,000 short in purchasing this promised land here to train more leaders to minister all over the Caribbean!
