The trick about these gifts is that they had to be hand made by the giver, no money spent. There were paintings, wall signs, plant holders, jewelry, decorations, even a coconut leaf hat! It was lots of fun.

The covid restrictions here are still pretty severe. The government eased up a little so we could still have the traditional Christmas morning service in the churches at 6:00 am, and "Old Year's Night" service from 10 pm to midnight on New Year's Eve. We are now allowed to have more than 25

people, and they can sit three feet apart instead of six, if at least 70 percent of the people are vaccinated. We still have to take temperature, sanitize our hands and write down our names on entering the building.
