They later moved to the island of St. Lucia where in 1979, they established the Windward Islands School of Evangelism, which moved to St. Vincent in 1980. Her parents, Sam and Irene Galloway; her husband, Bob; and her son, Steve, preceded Jackie in death. She is survived by two sons, Dan (wife Marla) and Jim (wife Linda); a daughter-in-law, Patti Frisbee; three sisters, Kay Boley, Jane Seiling, and Janet McCormick; seven grandchildren, 22 great grandchildren, and several nieces and nephews. She also considered countless students her kids and grandkids through the years all over the Caribbean.
