Short-term Teachers Needed

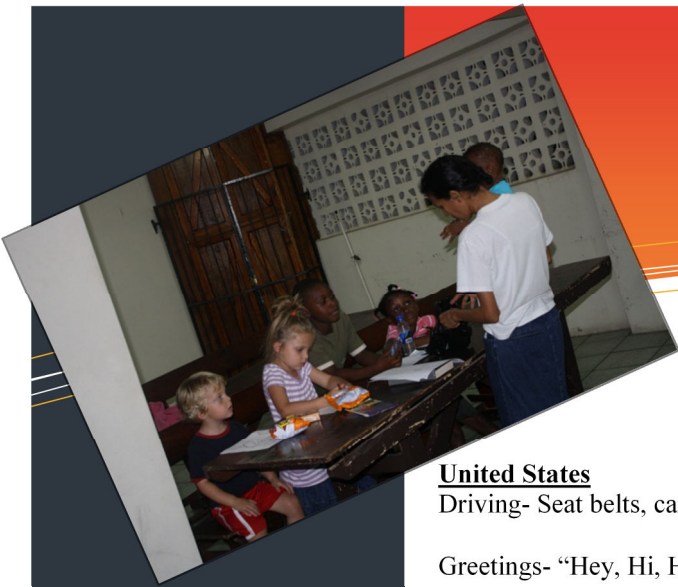
