

NEW SCHOOL YEAR BEGINS IN SPITE OF COVID REGULATIONS

We have waited a bit to send off this letter to see how the dust would settle for our new students. Well, not all the dust has settled yet, but classes at WISE are underway for the 2021-2022 school year. COVID has made it exceptionally difficult for our international students to travel to Barbados. Last year there were half a dozen Haitian students who wanted to come, but none were able to make it. We are excited that two of them were able to make it this year, although not without challenges. They ran into a problem on the day of their departure from Haiti and had to reschedule to the next day. Then they had to spend several days in Jamaica before getting a connecting flight to Barbados. Upon arrival, one of them tested positive and had to spend 10 days in quarantine. (The other one spent the normal five to six days before being retested and released.) But Ritchey and Steve are here and excited to FINALLY begin their studies at WISE!

As of this writing, there are three other new students who are in various stages of travel arrangements: a woman from Haiti, a man from Nigeria and a man from Pakistan. So, it looks like our incoming class will number about five, which is not a lot, but up from last year. We are using an online platform to help these incoming students keep up with their lectures and assignments so they will not be hopelessly behind by the time they arrive. Others have said they are going to wait because of COVID, and still others have expressed enthusiastic interest but were just too late to apply for this year. Hopefully by next year we will see a definite upward trend in enrollment!

COVID has been surging in Barbados, as in many places around the world. It is now common to see over 150 new cases a day, which seems small by U.S. standards, but was unheard of in Barbados until recently. There were 168 new cases on September 22, an all-time high. Human resources are being stretched thin, as well as accommodations for quarantine purposes. The churches are under tight restrictions, limited to 25 people for services. The trajectory is definitely not good right now, and people here are quite concerned. Please keep the Barbadian churches and church leaders in prayer.
